



## 2007+ DST - Fall Back pre v8.30

On AudioVAULT version previous to 8.30 follow the instructions in this document to configure Spring Forward DST settings on all AudioVAULT computers.

The 1 a.m. hour repeats itself, which makes this a 25-hour day, so the schedule for this day must accommodate the extra events in the 1 a.m. format. Depending on how you accomplish your scheduling, the music and commercial scheduling systems may also have to produce extra events for this hour.

In order to accommodate the extra hour in the day, a few steps must be taken to prepare the system's programming.

### For AVAir:

Anytime after the 2:00 a.m. time change, the system can be set back *manually* an hour by an operator.

The 1 a.m. format should contain two-hours worth of material with no update commands. Instead, include an update with an Update End Time of 02:00:00 at the top of the 2 a.m. format. All other updates should be scheduled normally. With that change, this format has an update at the top of the 2 a.m. hour to exit the 1 a.m. format, at which point regular programming takes over. This will take care of the scheduling issues.

### For AVSat:

The 1 a.m. hour in the Playlist should contain two-hours worth of material with no Aligns. Adjustments may also need to be made to the Control playlist. Aligns can be scheduled normally beginning with the 2 a.m. hour. With that change, this hour has an align event in the 2 a.m. hour to exit the 1 a.m. hour, at which point regular programming takes over. This will take care of the scheduling issues.

Anytime after the 2:00 a.m. time change, the system can be set back *manually* an hour by an operator. **Windows should not be allowed to handle the time change automatically.** To change the time manually, AVAir does not need to be shut down. Simply open the Control Panel, double click the Time/Date icon, and reset the time. This will set the system clock without interrupting the program. Alternately, if AVTime is installed on your system, reset the clock on the Master AVTime computer, and let AVTime broadcast the change to the rest of the system. If AVTime running as slave turns pink instead of green you will have to click on the Ok button to accept the 60-minute time change.
